The 2011 Murray-Darling Basin Plan stands to have the largest single impact on water availability in the Murrumbidgee Valley in the history of water reform. The Draft Basin Plan is being developed now by the Murray-Darling Basin Authority for release in July 2010.

Regional irrigation businesses and local government groups have been active on this issue for some time and with the Draft Basin Plan soon to be released, it is time our communities had the opportunity to learn more about the Plan and its potential impacts.
